3. Hardware/Software Specification


The following is a list of the different hardware and software items will be needed to create to develop the software properly:

Server: Computer Science Dept. Linux server(Ubuntu) to store all information


Users: Personal computers to access website Coding standard: PHP using Zend framework Database: MySQL using PHP MyAdmin

4. GUI Screenshots






Above is an image of what the login screen for the application will look like. Users will need to enter a username and password in order to do anything with the system.


